AGREEMENT

1. AGREEMENT. Buyer agrees to buy and Seller agrees to sell, the Property described below on the terms and conditions set forth in this contract (Contract).

2. PARTIES AND PROPERTY.

2.2. No Assignability. This Contract **IS NOT** assignable by Buyer unless otherwise specified in **Additional Provisions**.

2.3. Seller. THISTLE VELO, LLC, a Colorado limited liability company (Seller) is the current owner of the Property described below.

2.4. Property. The Property is the following legally described real estate in the County of Boulder, Colorado:

together with the interests, easements, rights, benefits, improvements and attached fixtures appurtenant thereto, and all interest of Seller in vacated streets and alleys adjacent thereto, except as herein excluded (Property).

If MEC occurs prior to the completion of construction for the Property, Buyer understands that the legal description and the street address for the Property may change during the entitlement process for the condominium project, and in the event of such change, Seller shall notify Buyer of any change in the address and legal description of the Unit prior to Closing, and this Paragraph 4 shall be deemed amended to identify the Property as set forth in such notice.

2.5. Inclusions. The Purchase Price includes the following items (Inclusions):

2.5.1. Inclusions – Attached. If attached to the Property on the date of this Contract, the following items are included unless excluded under **Exclusions**: lighting, heating, plumbing, ventilating and air conditioning units, TV antennas, inside telephone, network and coaxial (cable) wiring and connecting blocks/jacks, plants, mirrors, floor coverings, intercom systems, built-in kitchen appliances, sprinkler systems and controls, built-in vacuum systems (including accessories), and garage door openers (including any applicable remote controls). If checked, the following are owned by the Seller and included (leased items should be listed under **Due Diligence Documents**): ☒ **None** ☐ **Solar Panels** ☐ **Water Softeners** ☐ **Security Systems** ☐ **Satellite Systems** (including satellite dishes). If any additional items are attached to the Property after the date of this Contract, such additional items are also included in the Purchase Price.

2.5.2. Inclusions – Not Attached. If on the Property, whether attached or not, on the date of this Contract, the following items are included unless excluded under **Exclusions**: storm windows, storm doors, window and porch shades, awnings, blinds, screens, window coverings and treatments, curtain rods, drapery rods, fireplace inserts, fireplace screens, fireplace grates, heating stoves, storage sheds, carbon monoxide alarms, smoke/fire detectors and all keys.

2.5.3. Personal Property – Conveyance. [Intentionally Deleted]

78 **4.2. Seller Concession. [Intentionally Deleted]**

79 **4.3. Earnest Money.** The Earnest Money set forth in this Section (Earnest Money), in the form of a cashier's check,
80 personal check or wire transfer, will be payable to and held by LAND TITLE GUARANTEE COMPANY, 2595 Canyon Blvd
81 #340, Boulder, CO 80302 (Earnest Money Holder), in its trust account, on behalf of both Seller and Buyer. The Earnest Money
82 deposit must be tendered, by Buyer, with this Contract unless the parties mutually agree to an **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline**
83 for its payment. The parties authorize delivery of the Earnest Money deposit to the company conducting the Closing (Closing
84 Company), if any, at or before Closing. In the event Earnest Money Holder has agreed to have interest on Earnest Money deposits
85 transferred to a fund established for the purpose of providing affordable housing to Colorado residents, Seller and Buyer acknowledge
86 and agree that any interest accruing on the Earnest Money deposited with the Earnest Money Holder in this transaction will be
87 transferred to such fund.

88 **4.3.1. Alternative Earnest Money Deadline.** The deadline for delivering the Earnest Money, if other than at the
89 time of tender of this Contract, is as set forth as the **Alternative Earnest Money Deadline**.

4.3.2. Return of Earnest Money. If Buyer has a Right to Terminate and timely terminates, Buyer is entitled to the return of Earnest Money as provided in this Contract. If this Contract is terminated as set forth in § 25 and, except as provided in § 24, (Earnest Money Dispute), if the Earnest Money has not already been returned following receipt of a Notice to Terminate, Seller agrees to execute and return to Buyer or Broker working with Buyer, written mutual instructions (e.g., Earnest Money Release form), within three days of Seller's receipt of such form.

4.4. Form of Funds; Time of Payment; Available Funds.

4.4.1. Good Funds. All amounts payable by the parties at Closing, including any loan proceeds, Cash at Closing and closing costs, must be in funds that comply with all applicable Colorado laws, including electronic transfer funds, certified check, savings and loan teller's check and cashier's check (Good Funds).

4.4.2. Time of Payment; Available Funds. All funds, including the Purchase Price to be paid by Buyer, must be paid before or at Closing or as otherwise agreed in writing between the parties to allow disbursement by Closing Company at Closing **OR SUCH NONPAYING PARTY WILL BE IN DEFAULT.** Buyer represents that Buyer, as of the date of this Contract, ☐ **Does** ☐ **Does Not** have funds that are immediately verifiable and available in an amount not less than the amount stated as Cash at Closing in § 4.1.

4.5. New Loan.

4.5.1. Buyer to Pay Loan Costs. Buyer, except as otherwise permitted in § 4.2, (Seller Concession), if applicable, must timely pay Buyer's loan costs, loan discount points, prepaid items and loan origination fees, as required by lender.

4.5.2. Buyer May Select Financing. Buyer may pay in cash or select financing appropriate and acceptable to Buyer, including a different loan than initially sought, except as restricted in § 4.5.3 (Loan Limitations) or § 30 (Additional Provisions).

4.5.3. Loan Limitations. Buyer may purchase the Property using any of the following types of loans:

4.5.4. Loan Estimate – Monthly Payment and Loan Costs. Buyer is advised to review the terms, conditions and costs of Buyer's New Loan carefully. If Buyer is applying for a residential loan, the lender generally must provide Buyer with a Loan Estimate within three days after Buyer completes a loan application. Buyer also should obtain an estimate of the amount of Buyer's monthly mortgage payment.

TRANSACTION PROVISIONS

5. FINANCING CONDITIONS AND OBLIGATIONS.

5.1. New Loan Application. If Buyer is to pay all or part of the Purchase Price by obtaining one or more new loans (New Loan), or if an existing loan is not to be released at Closing, Buyer, if required by such lender, must make an application verifiable by such lender, on or before New **Loan Application Deadline** and exercise reasonable efforts to obtain such loan or approval.

5.2. New Loan Review. If Buyer is to pay all or part of the Purchase Price with a New Loan, this Contract is conditional upon Buyer determining, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, whether the New Loan is satisfactory to Buyer, including its availability, payments, interest rate, terms, conditions and cost. This condition is for the sole benefit of Buyer. Buyer has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before New **Loan Termination Deadline**, if the New Loan is not satisfactory to Buyer, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. Buyer does not have a Right to Terminate based on the New Loan if the objection is based on the Appraised Value (defined below) or the Lender Requirements (defined below). **IF SELLER IS NOT IN DEFAULT AND DOES NOT TIMELY RECEIVE BUYER'S WRITTEN NOTICE TO TERMINATE, BUYER'S EARNEST MONEY WILL BE NONREFUNDABLE**, except as otherwise provided in this Contract (e.g., Appraisal, Title, Survey).

5.3. Credit Information. If an existing loan is not to be released at Closing, this Contract is conditional (for the sole benefit of Seller) upon Seller's approval of Buyer's financial ability and creditworthiness, which approval will be in Seller's sole subjective discretion. Accordingly: (1) Buyer must supply to Seller by **Buyer's Credit Information Deadline**, at Buyer's expense, information and documents (including a current credit report) concerning Buyer's financial, employment and credit condition; (2) Buyer consents that Seller may verify Buyer's financial ability and creditworthiness; and (3) any such information and documents received by Seller must be held by Seller in confidence, and not released to others except to protect Seller's interest in this transaction. If the Cash at Closing is less than as set forth in § 4.1 of this Contract, Seller has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before Closing. If Seller disapproves of Buyer's financial ability or creditworthiness, in Seller's sole subjective discretion, Seller has the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before **Disapproval of Buyer's Credit Information Deadline**.

146 company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Seller's expense. On or before **Record Title Deadline**, Seller must furnish
147 to Buyer, a current commitment for an owner's title insurance policy (Title Commitment), in an amount equal to the Purchase Price,
148 or if this box is checked, ☐ an **Abstract of Title** certified to a current date. Seller will cause the title insurance policy to be issued
149 and delivered to Buyer as soon as practicable at or after Closing.

150 ☐ 8.1.2. Buyer Selects Title Insurance Company. If this box is checked, Buyer will select the title insurance
151 company to furnish the owner's title insurance policy at Buyer's expense. On or before **Record Title Deadline**, Buyer must furnish to
152 Seller, a current commitment for owner's title insurance policy (Title Commitment), in an amount equal to the Purchase Price.

154 8.1.3. Owner's Extended Coverage (OEC). The Title Commitment ☒ **Will** ☐ **Will Not** contain Owner's
155 Extended Coverage (OEC). If the Title Commitment is to contain OEC, it will commit to delete or insure over the standard exceptions
156 which relate to: (1) parties in possession, (2) unrecorded easements, (3) survey matters, (4) unrecorded mechanics' liens, (5) gap
157 period (period between the effective date and time of commitment to the date and time the deed is recorded), and (6) unpaid taxes,
158 assessments and unredeemed tax sales prior to the year of Closing. Any additional premium expense to obtain OEC will be paid by ☐

160 Regardless of whether the Contract requires OEC, the Title Insurance Commitment may not provide OEC or delete or insure over
161 any or all of the standard exceptions for OEC. The Title Insurance Company may require a New Survey or New ILC, defined below,
162 among other requirements for OEC. If the Title Insurance Commitment is not satisfactory to Buyer, Buyer has a right to object under
163 § 8.45 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution).

164 8.1.4. Title Documents. Title Documents consist of the following: (1) copies of any plats, declarations, covenants,
165 conditions and restrictions burdening the Property, and (2) copies of any other documents (or, if illegible, summaries of such
166 documents) listed in the schedule of exceptions (Exceptions) in the Title Commitment furnished to Buyer (collectively, Title
167 Documents).

168 8.1.5. Copies of Title Documents. Buyer must receive, on or before **Record Title Deadline**, copies of all Title
169 Documents. This requirement pertains only to documents as shown of record in the office of the clerk and recorder in the county
170 where the Property is located. The cost of furnishing copies of the documents required in this Section will be at the expense of the
171 party or parties obligated to pay for the owner's title insurance policy.

172 8.1.6. Existing Abstracts of Title. Seller must deliver to Buyer copies of any abstracts of title covering all or any
173 portion of the Property (Abstract of Title) in Seller's possession on or before **Record Title Deadline**.

174 8.2. Record Title. Buyer has the right to review and object to the Abstract of Title or Title Commitment and any of the
175 Title Documents as set forth in § 8.45 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution) on or before **Record Title Objection Deadline**. Buyer's
176 objection may be based on any unsatisfactory form or content of Title Commitment or Abstract of Title, notwithstanding § 13, or
177 any other unsatisfactory title condition, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion. If the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title
178 Documents are not received by Buyer, on or before the **Record Title Deadline**, or if there is an endorsement to the Title Commitment
179 that adds a new Exception to title, a copy of the new Exception to title and the modified Title Commitment will be delivered to
180 Buyer. Buyer has until the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt of such documents by Buyer to review and object to: (1) any
181 required Title Document not timely received by Buyer, (2) any change to the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment or Title Documents,
182 or (3) any endorsement to the Title Commitment. If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection,
183 pursuant to this § 8.2 (Record Title), any title objection by Buyer is governed by the provisions set forth in § 8.4 (Right to Object to
184 Title, Resolution). If Seller has fulfilled all Seller's obligations, if any, to deliver to Buyer all documents required by § 8.1 (Evidence
185 of Record Title) and Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection by the applicable deadline
186 specified above, Buyer accepts the condition of title as disclosed by the Abstract of Title, Title Commitment and Title Documents
187 as satisfactory.

188 8.3. Off-Record Title. Seller must deliver to Buyer, on or before Off-Record Title Deadline, true copies of all existing surveys
189 in Seller's possession pertaining to the Property and must disclose to Buyer all easements, liens (including, without limitation,
190 governmental improvements approved, but not yet installed) or other title matters (including, without limitation, rights of first refusal
191 and options) not shown by public records, of which Seller has actual knowledge (Off-Record Matters). This Section excludes any New
192 ILC or New Survey governed under § 9 (New ILC, New Survey). Buyer has the right to inspect the Property to investigate if any third
193 party has any right in the Property not shown by public records (e.g., unrecorded easement, boundary line discrepancy or water rights).
194 Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection of any unsatisfactory condition (whether disclosed by Seller or revealed by
195 such inspection, notwithstanding § 8.2 (Record Title) and § 13 (Transfer of Title)), in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, must be
196 received by Seller on or before Off-Record Title Objection Deadline. If an Off-Record Matter is received by Buyer after the Off-Record
197 Title Deadline, Buyer has until the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt by Buyer to review and object to such Off-Record Matter.

198 If Seller receives Buyer's Notice to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection pursuant to this § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), any title objection
199 by Buyer is governed by the provisions set forth in § 8.5 (Right to Object to Title, Resolution). If Seller does not receive Buyer's Notice
200 to Terminate or Notice of Title Objection by the applicable deadline specified above, Buyer accepts title subject to such Off-Record
201 Matters and rights, if any, of third parties not shown by public records of which Buyer has actual knowledge.

202 **8.4. Special Taxing Districts. SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS MAY BE SUBJECT TO GENERAL OBLIGATION**
203 **INDEBTEDNESS THAT IS PAID BY REVENUES PRODUCED FROM ANNUAL TAX LEVIES ON THE TAXABLE**
204 **PROPERTY WITHIN SUCH DISTRICTS. PROPERTY OWNERS IN SUCH DISTRICTS MAY BE PLACED AT RISK**
205 **FOR INCREASED MILL LEVIES AND TAX TO SUPPORT THE SERVICING OF SUCH DEBT WHERE**
206 **CIRCUMSTANCES ARISE RESULTING IN THE INABILITY OF SUCH A DISTRICT TO DISCHARGE SUCH**
207 **INDEBTEDNESS WITHOUT SUCH AN INCREASE IN MILL LEVIES. BUYERS SHOULD INVESTIGATE THE**
208 **SPECIAL TAXING DISTRICTS IN WHICH THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED BY CONTACTING THE COUNTY**
209 **TREASURER, BY REVIEWING THE CERTIFICATE OF TAXES DUE FOR THE PROPERTY AND BY OBTAINING**
210 **FURTHER INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, THE COUNTY CLERK AND**
211 **RECORDER, OR THE COUNTY ASSESSOR.**

212 A tax certificate from the respective county treasurer listing any special taxing districts that effect the Property (Tax Certificate)
213 must be delivered to Buyer on or before **Record Title Deadline**. If the Property is located within a special taxing district and such
214 inclusion is unsatisfactory to Buyer, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, Buyer may object, on or before **Record Title Objection**
215 **Deadline**. If the Tax Certificate shows that the Property is included in a special taxing district and is received by Buyer after the
216 **Record Title Deadline**, Buyer has until the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt by Buyer to review and object to the Property's
217 inclusion in a special taxing district as unsatisfactory to Buyer.

218 **8.5. Right to Object to Title, Resolution.** Buyer's right to object, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion, to any title matters
219 includes those matters set forth in § 8.2 (Record Title), § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), § 8.4 (Special Taxing District) and § 13 (Transfer of
220 Title). If Buyer objects to any title matter, on or before the applicable deadline, Buyer has the following options:

221 **8.5.1. Title Objection, Resolution.** If Seller receives Buyer's written notice objecting to any title matter (Notice of
222 Title Objection) on or before the applicable deadline, and if Buyer and Seller have not agreed to a written settlement thereof on or
223 before Title Resolution Deadline, this Contract will terminate on the expiration of Title Resolution Deadline, unless Seller receives
224 Buyer's written withdrawal of Buyer's Notice of Title Objection (i.e., Buyer's written notice to waive objection to such items and
225 waives the Right to Terminate for that reason), on or before expiration of Title Resolution Deadline. If either the Record Title
226 Deadline or the Off-Record Title Deadline, or both, are extended to the earlier of Closing or ten days after receipt of the applicable
227 documents by Buyer, pursuant to § 8.2 (Record Title) or § 8.3 (Off-Record Title), the Title Resolution Deadline also will be
228 automatically extended to the earlier of Closing or fifteen days after Buyer's receipt of the applicable documents; or

229 **8.5.2. Title Objection, Right to Terminate.** Buyer may exercise the Right to Terminate under § 25.1, on or before
230 the applicable deadline, based on any unsatisfactory title matter, in Buyer's sole subjective discretion.

231 **8.6. Right of First Refusal or Contract Approval.** If there is a right of first refusal on the Property or a right to approve
232 this Contract, Seller must promptly submit this Contract according to the terms and conditions of such right. If the holder of the right

234 right of first refusal is waived explicitly or expires, or the Contract is approved, this Contract will remain in full force and effect.

236 Contract has not occurred on or before **Right of First Refusal Deadline**, this Contract will then terminate.

The obligation to mediate, unless otherwise agreed, will terminate if the entire dispute is not resolved within thirty days of the date written notice requesting mediation is delivered by one party to the other at that party's last known address (physical or electronic as provided in § 27). Nothing in this Section prohibits either party from filing a lawsuit and recording a *lis pendens* affecting the Property, before or after the date of written notice requesting mediation. This Section will not alter any date in this Contract, unless otherwise agreed.

24. EARNEST MONEY DISPUTE. Except as otherwise provided herein, Earnest Money Holder must release the Earnest Money following receipt of written mutual instructions, signed by both Buyer and Seller. In the event of any controversy regarding the Earnest Money, Earnest Money Holder is not required to release the Earnest Money. Earnest Money Holder, in its sole subjective discretion, has several options: (1) wait for any proceeding between Buyer and Seller; (2) interplead all parties and deposit Earnest Money into a court of competent jurisdiction, (Earnest Money Holder is entitled to recover court costs and reasonable attorney and legal fees incurred with such action); or (3) provide notice to Buyer and Seller that unless Earnest Money Holder receives a copy of the Summons and Complaint or Claim (between Buyer and Seller) containing the case number of the lawsuit (Lawsuit) within one hundred twenty days of Earnest Money Holder's notice to the parties, Earnest Money Holder is authorized to return the Earnest Money to Buyer. In the event Earnest Money Holder does receive a copy of the Lawsuit, and has not interpleaded the monies at the time of any Order, Earnest Money Holder must disburse the Earnest Money pursuant to the Order of the Court. The parties reaffirm the obligation of § 23 (Mediation). This Section will survive cancellation or termination of this Contract.

25. TERMINATION.

25.1. Right to Terminate. If a party has a right to terminate, as provided in this Contract (Right to Terminate), the termination is effective upon the other party's receipt of a written notice to terminate (Notice to Terminate), provided such written notice was received on or before the applicable deadline specified in this Contract. If the Notice to Terminate is not received on or before the specified deadline, the party with the Right to Terminate accepts the specified matter, document or condition as satisfactory and waives the Right to Terminate under such provision.

25.2. Effect of Termination. In the event this Contract is terminated, all Earnest Money received hereunder will be returned to Buyer and the parties are relieved of all obligations hereunder, subject to §§ 10.4, 22, 23 and 24.

26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT, MODIFICATION, SURVIVAL; SUCCESSORS. This Contract, its exhibits and specified addenda, constitute the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject hereof, and any prior agreements pertaining thereto, whether oral or written, have been merged and integrated into this Contract. No subsequent modification of any of the terms of this Contract is valid, binding upon the parties, or enforceable unless made in writing and signed by the parties. Any right or obligation in this Contract that, by its terms, exists or is intended to be performed after termination or Closing survives the same. Any successor to a party receives the predecessor's benefits and obligations of this Contract.

27. NOTICE, DELIVERY AND CHOICE OF LAW.

27.1. Physical Delivery and Notice. Any document, or notice to Buyer or Seller must be in writing, except as provided in § 27.2 and is effective when physically received by such party, any individual named in this Contract to receive documents or notices for such party, Broker, or Brokerage Firm of Broker working with such party (except any notice or delivery after Closing must be received by the party, not Broker or Brokerage Firm).

27.2. Electronic Notice. As an alternative to physical delivery, any notice, may be delivered in electronic form to Buyer or Seller, any individual named in this Contract to receive documents or notices for such party, Broker or Brokerage Firm of Broker working with such party (except any notice or delivery after Closing must be received by the party, not Broker or Brokerage Firm) at the electronic address of the recipient by facsimile, email or text.

27.3. Electronic Delivery. Electronic Delivery of documents and notice may be delivered by: (1) email at the email address of the recipient, (2) a link or access to a website or server provided the recipient receives the information necessary to access the documents, or (3) facsimile at the facsimile number (Fax No.) of the recipient.

27.4. Choice of Law. This Contract and all disputes arising hereunder are governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado that would be applicable to Colorado residents who sign a contract in Colorado for real property located in Colorado.

28. NOTICE OF ACCEPTANCE, COUNTERPARTS. This proposal will expire unless accepted in writing, by Buyer and Seller, as evidenced by their signatures below, and the offering party receives notice of such acceptance pursuant to § 27 on or before **Acceptance Deadline Date** and **Acceptance Deadline Time**. If accepted, this document will become a contract between Seller and Buyer. A copy of this Contract may be executed by each party, separately, and when each party has executed a copy thereof, such copies taken together are deemed to be a full and complete contract between the parties.
